



LOCH TAY (s)

- early season variety, 10-14 days before Loch Ness
- spine-free
- the berries are firm, uniformly round, with a rich black glossy appearance
- Excellent flavour, the berries are sufficiently
- very good shelf-life
- crops for a full six weeks
- semi-erect spine-free habit

LOCH NESS

- Loch Ness is a high yielding, high quality spine-free variety
- the berries are large, very firm with a rich glossy black colour
- the flavour develops as fruit ripens and is very pleasant when the berries are fully ripe
- Very good shelf-life
- Warm and wet weather can highlight the variety's susceptibility to down mildew which needs to be controlled regularly
- Loch Ness produces strongly erect canes
- the plant has a good winter hardiness

ASTERINA® fruloche (s)

- Loch Ness is a high yielding, high quality spine-free variety
- the berries are large, very firm with a rich glossy black colour
- the flavour develops as fruit ripens and is very pleasant when the berries are fully ripe
- Very good shelf-life
- Warm and wet weather can highlight the variety's susceptibility to Down Mildew which needs to be controlled regularly
- Loch Ness produces strongly erect canes
- the plant has a good winter hardiness

SWEET ROYALLA®

- this new variety of blackberry is characterized by particularly large fruit
- the shiny fruit is larger and more elongated than Loch Ness
- As soon as the fruits turn into black they are ready for consumption, even if the aroma is not yet fully developed.
- yield can reach that of Loch Ness
- ripening of Sweet Royalla® starts 4-5 days before Loch Ness
- Pedals detach poorly and partially dry up on the fruit
